

Trails Engineering Assistance Grant 2025-2026

Communities, Culture, Tourism and Heritage (CCTH) is committed to enhancing trail infrastructure through the Trail Engineering Assistance Grant (TEAG). This program provides essential funding for trail builders and managers, enabling them to engage engineering expertise when necessary. TEAG supports organizations and municipalities in constructing, maintaining, and managing multi-use and non-motorized single-use trails. Through this initiative, we strive to ensure that the trails in Nova Scotia are both safe for users and environmentally sustainable.

ELIGIBILITY AND GUIDELINES

Proposals will be accepted from the following organizations providing they have a mandate to build, maintain, and support trails:

- Public organizations incorporated as non-profit societies under the Societies Act (Nova Scotia) and other public organizations deemed equivalent by CCTH
- Municipal units designated under the Municipal Government Act (Nova Scotia)

ELIGIBLE INITIATIVES

- Inspection and assessment of existing trail structures
- Components of planning requiring an engineer (i.e. site plan for a bridge)
- Design of trail components which must be engineered to a specific standard.
- Rehabilitation plans
- Other occasions when it is appropriate to seek the advice of a professional engineer.

Applicants are encouraged to contribute to the overall cost of the initiative. The contribution level required depends on need and the ability of the applicant to contribute.

Applications received from provincial or regional organizations must show support for the initiative from local trail groups or municipal unit(s).

CONTRIBUTION GUIDELINES

- Level of contribution will be based on need and the applicant's ability to contribute. The expected level of contribution by the applicant from sources other than CCTH is 50%.
- In kind contributions are acceptable.
- May be applied for on an annual basis

APPLICATION PROCEDURE AND PROCESS

- Applicants are encouraged to contact the Trails Consultant to discuss the proposal, determine eligibility, and provide relevant advice or assistance.
- Applications will be accepted between April 1st and February 1st of any given year.

Applications will be reviewed by the Trails Consultant.

 Applicants will be notified on the status of the application within 30 days of the application being reviewed.

GRANT DISBURSEMENTS

If approved:

- Payment is provided after an agreement outlining the terms and conditions of the project has been signed and submitted via email to <u>cchtrailgrants@novascotia.ca</u>, fax or mail.
- Payments are made at 100% unless otherwise stated in the agreement.
- Should the project or budget need to be revised or modified, written permission to reallocate funding is required from the Trails Consultant prior to doing so.
- Failure to provide the completed final report can make the applicant ineligible to receive any future grants from CCTH until this information has been submitted.
- The final report includes a written report and financial statement. Deadline to submit is provided in the Terms and Conditions document.
- If there is a final payment outstanding it will be issued upon completion of the initiative and submission of a final report.
- If the project is not undertaken or completed after payment of the grant has been made, the recipient must return unused funds to CCTH payable to the Minister of Finance.
